Since 2014, Tami has been Professor for Accounting and Director of the Institute of Accounting, Control and Auditing at the University of St.Gallen in Switzerland. Before that she was Lecturer (Assistant Professor) in the School of Accounting at UNSW Sydney, Australia for several years. She taught and researched at the Universities of Augsburg and Jena in Germany and spent a study exchange year at the University of Örebro in Sweden. Tami teaches Financial Reporting, Financial Statement Analysis, Group Accounting and Accounting Research in the Master of Accounting and Finance (MAccFin) program as well as at the PhD level. She is an instructor in the St.Gallen MBA and other customer-tailored executive programs. Previous to academia, Tami worked as Consultant for PricewaterhouseCoopers in Hamburg and did an internship at Allianz General Insurance in Ho-Chi-Minh-City in Vietnam.

In her research, Tami focuses on international accounting and financial accounting, particularly IFRS, intangible assets and non-GAAP earnings. Current research projects on incentive contract choices further comprise behavioural effects, using experimental research designs. She regularly presents her work at international conferences and has published in various international journals such as e.g., *European Accounting Review*, *ABACUS*, *Journal of Business Finance & Accounting*, *Behavioral Research in Accounting*, *Accounting & Finance*, *Journal of International Financial Management & Accounting*, *Schmalenbach Business Review*.

Tami is co-founder of the Swiss Accounting Research Alpine Camp (SARAC), Committee Chair of the International Accounting Section of the American Accounting Association, Scientific Board Member of the European Network of Experimental Accounting Research (ENEAR) and she was Senior Editor of the first edition of the Events section of the Accounting Research Center of the European Accounting Association (EAA). She is also serving the EAA as Board member representing Switzerland.
