The WHO also estimates that the cost of mental health problems is \$1.2 trillion per year, or 1.2% of the world's GDP (WHO, 1994).

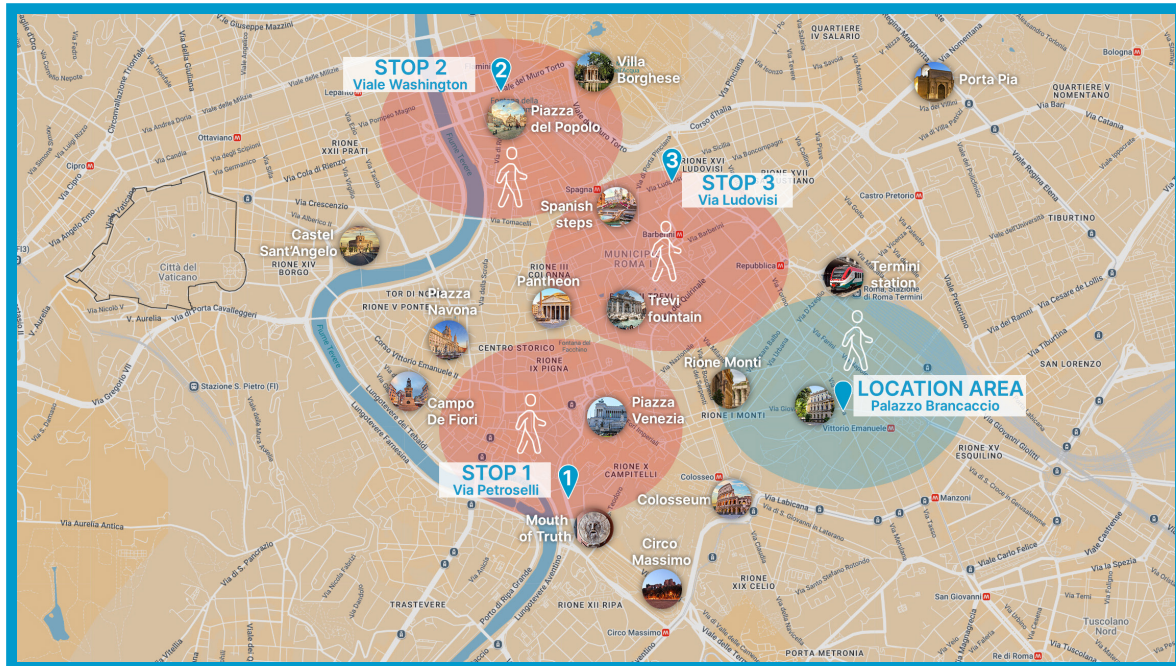

CLASSROOM SESSION

Teaching Sustainability Accounting with Cases and Exercises

Thursday, May 29, 14:00–15:30 room 201

Sustainability accounting has become more ubiquitous than ever. With exponential interest in topics such as environmental impact, greenhouse gas emissions, social and human rights issues, lifecycle analysis and circular economy, sustainability reporting standards, its integration into business school programs and curricula has become increasingly essential.

The EAA Annual Congress 2025 Classroom Session, brought to participants by the EAA Education Committee, highlights the importance of thoughtfully including sustainability topics into the classroom. It aims to equip higher education instructors with the tools to effectively deliver key concepts, research themes and debates in an engaging and meaningful way.

Professor Charles H. Cho will lead a hands-on workshop on educational content that can be effectively used in teaching sustainability accounting with cases and exercises. The session will feature fellow accounting educators who will share their experiences with innovative content, diverse methodological approaches, and different contextual perspectives. Presenters will show their own sustainability accounting cases—developed and used in their courses—followed by a live, practical demonstration of how they teach them in the classroom. Attendees will gain valuable insights into effective ways to integrate these cases into their own courses. The session will conclude with an interactive Q&A.

The four cases covered in the session will explore the following topics:

1. Carbon accounting
2. Materiality assessment
3. Social audit
4. Inclusive leadership and decision-making

These cases are drawn from Cho, Costa and Korca (forthcoming) and offer a rich foundation for engaging students in sustainability accounting.

Biography Charles H. Cho is Professor of Sustainability Accounting and the Erivan K. Haub Chair in Business & Sustainability at the Schulich School of Business, York University. He has over 20 years of experience in teaching (undergraduate, MBA, MSc, PhD and executive programs in various universities), researching and engaging with the sustainability, social and environmental accounting and reporting (SSEAR) field in multiple countries. His research has been published in leading academic journals. He is a member of the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI)'s Global Sustainability Standards Board. As a globally recognized scholar, he frequently delivers keynotes and ranks among the top 2 per cent of cited accounting researchers worldwide. He has also worked for KPMG LLP and other public accounting firms for several years in auditing and taxation.

Notably, the shark tank event has a pre-conference stage in which a written 2-page pitch of about 1,000 words was submitted, comprising eleven inter-connected items: working title; research question; key papers; motivation; idea; data; tools; what’s new?; so what?; contribution and other considerations. The research teams linked to the best 10 written pitches are now invited to make oral pitch presentations to an Editors Panel of Sharks in this dedicated EAA session, split into 2 concurrent streams of 5 pitches. The shark panels will represent the following 14 journals: *Abacus*; *Accounting and Business Research*; *Accounting Forum*; *Accounting & Finance*; *Accounting in Europe*; *Accounting Horizons*; *Australian Accounting Review*; *British Accounting Review*; *European Accounting Review*; *Financial Accountability & Management*; *Journal of Accounting Literature*; *Journal of International Accounting, Auditing and Taxation*; *Journal of International Financial Management & Accounting*; *Pacific-Basin Finance Journal*. Symposium 1

The Design of Publishable Studies Contributing to Policy Relevant Questions

Wednesday, May 28, 15:30–17:00 room **TD1**

The objective of the symposium is to stimulate academics to conduct more studies that can help standard setters to make informed decisions when standard-setters need to evaluate whether a certain standard has reached its intended objectives. In this symposium standard-setters will inform participants on the different types of questions standard-setters will have at the time when they evaluate as to whether or not a standard has reached its intended objectives after its implementation (for example are the intended objectives specified at the standards-development phase reached, what unintended consequences arise, what about comparability of the data, ...). Academic contributors to the panel could then inform participants as to what type research designs would be required to provide relevant findings to respond to the standard-setters' different types of questions they are seeking to answer when they evaluate whether a standard fulfilled the intended objectives. Are our traditional designs of studies (e.g. value relevance studies, analyst forecast research, ...) suitable to answer the questions of standard-setters or is there a gap which requires different designs? Elements that will be touched upon are definitions of variables, sampling strategies, choice of control groups, time frames (anticipation of new standard in development phase, early adoption by companies, behavior after mandatory adoption) and choice of research method (quantitative or qualitative). As a number of academic journals now offer the possibility to submit the design of an intended study as a registered report which is conditionally accepted for ultimate publication before the study has been conducted, this type of symposium also informs academics of this new possibility.

Sustainability Reporting Standards for SMEs—What are the Issues?

Thursday, May 29, 14:00–15:30 room TDI

The symposium will provide an update on the current developments of sustainability reporting for SMEs and a panel will discuss the issues that SMEs are confronted with in sustainability reporting. Issues to discuss include what are the challenges and opportunities going forward also in the context of the Omnibus Directive proposal, such as market acceptance, proportionality, cost/benefit considerations, and the balance between capability of SMEs to provide information and data needs of users.

In 2024 EFRAG consulted on exposure drafts for SMEs, including a voluntary sustainability reporting standard for non-listed SMEs (VSME). The VSME standard was published in December 2024.

The VSME Standard was developed as a reporting tool to assist non-listed micro-, small- and medium-sized enterprises (non-listed SMEs) in responding to requests for sustainability information that they receive from business counterparts (i.e., banks, investors or larger companies for which non-listed SMEs are suppliers) in an efficient and proportionate manner as well as to facilitate their participation in the transition to a sustainable economy. It was developed for SMEs with less than 250 employees. Based on market acceptance, the VSME is expected to standardise the current multiple ESG data requests. The European Commission intends to issue VSME (with some minor changes) as a recommendation in June 2025. Under the proposals for the Omnibus Directive a standard based on VSME will be adopted as a delegated act to define the value chain cap.

EFRAG is also developing an ecosystem for SMEs including a SME forum, mapping of tools and workshops to support the use of VSME.

Purpose to Impact: Accounting for Imagining Desirable Futures

SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE REPORT

The 2025 EAA conference will consist of research fora, parallel sessions and parallel sessions with discussants. Research fora (RF) are those sessions where papers which are in the initial stages of development are presented, whereas parallel sessions (PS) host more developed papers closer to publication. Among the latter, a group is usually selected to be presented and discussed by experts in the relevant areas (PSD sessions).

1399 papers were submitted for the 2025 conference. Of these, 22 were withdrawn, 179 were rejected, and 1,198 are expected to be presented at the conference (see table 1—data as of the day of writing this report, which may still undergo changes before the conference takes place), split between research fora (588) and parallel sessions (610). Table 1 also provides the breakdown of sessions for each category. The availability of additional space this year, compared to last year, has allowed increasing the quota of PS, restarting the trend towards increasing the percentage of PS sessions, which began a few years ago as a response to the negative connotation often attributed to research fora.

To address the critical issues concerning research fora, in previous SSC meetings, there was discussion about the opportunity to change the current configuration of sessions, with members agreeing that a gradual move away from the research forum format would be desirable. A gradual approach to rethink the configurations of sessions was also given the green light in a recent MC meeting. Along these lines, the SSC has taken a first step in approving an adjustment to the review process to allow a better assessment of the potential and stage of the papers at the stage of paper scoring and, thus, a better-informed decision and allocation to sessions. This new system will be tested in the coming year, providing a basis for future reconfigurations of sessions to be brought forward by the SSC.
