

## **Virtual Symposium on The Future of Financial Reporting 2026: The Statement of Cash Flows**

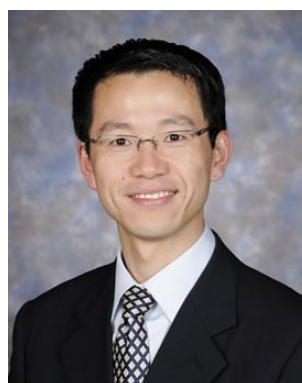
